The IEP is a crucial document for students aged 3 to 26 with disabilities who receive special education programs and related services in Michigan. It aims to identify each student's needs, set achievable learning goals, and outline the services provided by the school district to help the student reach these goals. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) defines the purpose of the IEP, while the Michigan Administrative Rules for Special Education (MARSE) define how Michigan implements these laws.
